Marjorie, said to me once, and I quote “ The one thing that I have done better than anything else, is encourage others to do something they’ve never done before”.

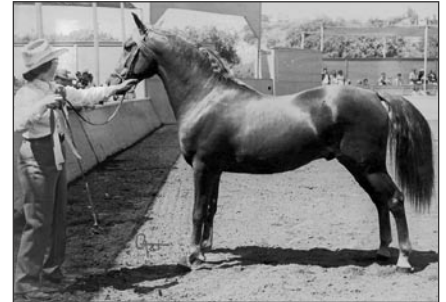
A staunch supporter and advocate for the Morgan Horse, she has lived up to this statement time and again. Her lifetime has been filled with encouraging others and doing many things not done before. Her achievements include breeding and showing Morgans, writing for a newspaper and periodicals, developing horse clubs and working with youth groups.

Marjorie and her husband, Richard, obtained their first registered Morgan mare in 1959. The love affair with the breed was instantaneous. Meetings with other owners and their horses, led to Marge and Richard’s desire to become involved in breeding and raising quality Morgans. Their search for a stallion led them to



of Farceur Morgan, whom they bought, developed into a show champion, and bred, producing 73 foals. Over the years, Marjorie has raised foals carrying the prefix’s Brave’s, Richwood and Farceur’s and some with no prefix at all. Many of these have gone on to be champion show horses in all of the different disciplines, including stock horse, trail and reining, saddle seat, hunt, western pleasure and English pleasure. No minor accomplishment!

Marjorie has not, however, been content to just raise champion Morgan horses. She has worked tirelessly to bring this great breed to the attention and appreciation of the general public. To this end, she wrote a Morgan News column for the Ramona Sentinel, which led to full page coverage of all horse news. Her success with this endeavor led to a publisher asking Marjorie to start a periodical, the Sentinel Horseman. Both publications, featured Morgan horses and promoted the breed as

had not been done before. Our own breed periodical, The Morgan Horse, engaged Marjorie, in the 1960’s, as a contributing author.

Marjorie and Richard were part of the driving force that created two of our major horse clubs in existence today. The first was the Morgan Horse Breeders and Exhibitors, where Richard was the first leader of the organizations’ youth group. When the club moved north, the Hazelwoods, along with two other

couples, began the San Diego Morgan Horse Club. Marjorie served this club as Secretary for a period of time and Richard served as its' President for four years. The two of them were successful in convincing the San Diego County Fair, the largest horse show in the area, to include Morgan Horse classes.



Marjorie, ever aware that our youth are the future of the breed, has over the years been actively involved with young horse lovers. She worked with 4-H club horse groups and in later years held youth horse camps in Placerville, Ca. Through her knowledge, diligence and dedication, many young people were introduced to the unique and wonderful qualities of the Morgan Horse.

During the 46 years that Marge and I have been friends, she has constantly been working to educate the public, teach the youth and promote the Morgan Horse. She has devoted her time and energy to being an advocate for this amazing breed from 4H leader to Region 7 Director.

The more than 300 horses raised by Marjorie and her family, have helped a herd full of Morgans own their own person! And having said that, it is with great pleasure and honor that I present this token of appreciation from owners and admirers of the Morgan Horse.
